**Liturgical Celebrations**

Friday 25th Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord

Pope Francis will consecrate Russia and Ukraine to the Immaculate Heart of Mary on Friday during the Celebration of Penance at 5 pm in St. Peter's Basilica. The same act, on the same day, will be carried out in Fatima by His Eminence Cardinal Krajewski, Apostolic Almoner, as envoy of the Holy Father. Cardinal Konrad Krajewski was one of two papal envoys sent to Ukraine last week in an expression of the Pope's concern for the war-torn country's population.

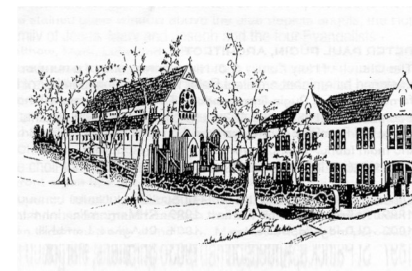
